





How do students' individual outlook on the world shape their education and career choices?


Students in degree programs traditionally associated with public sector work had higher levels of attraction to policy making

Public Policy Masters and Ph.D. Students are More Likely to Rate Gov't the Most Effective Institution for Solving Public Problems





Figure 5: Students Trust Government's Regulatory Authority



Most Graduate Students Think Their Program's Academic Support is Better Than Career Support



Ph.D. Students are Less Likely to Have Access to Career Services as Compared to Masters Students




