

Master of Science in Social Policy Program Approved Theory Electives

All courses in this document are approved Theory Electives for the MSSP program.

The Theory Elective requirement is intended to provide students with an understanding of how global forces such as capitalism, anti-Blackness, and settler colonialism influence policy formation and development. These courses also push students to wrestle with how to work through, with, and against policy to challenge global processes of oppression and build equitable, emancipatory, and justice-oriented worlds. MSSP Theory Electives examine these issues through the various frameworks of critical theory and through different assemblages of policy, governance, politics, and technology.

MSSP students are required to take one approved Theory Elective course from the list below. Students may take the Theory Elective in the fall or spring semester.
